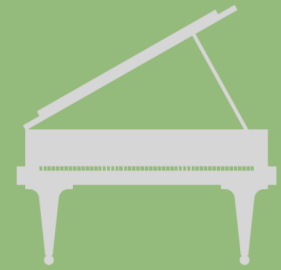

ADULT PROGRAMS

National Law Enforcement Museum

- **Affinity Project** – A three-part program that includes research, workshops, and community activation plans to strengthen relationships between law enforcement and the community.
- **Witness to History** – Panel discussion series that explores important historic moments in law enforcement history.
- **Conversations** – Panel discussion series that examines contemporary topics like opioids and predictive policing.
- **Brewsday** – After hours program for young professionals that offers fun and engaging ways to learn about law enforcement, while socializing with others with like-minded interests.
- **Talks with the Curator** – Monthly programs featuring curators who talk about collection topics.

Taft Museum of Art

- **Duncanson Artist-in-Residence Program** – A two-week residency that celebrates the achievements of contemporary African American artists in honor of Nicholas Longworth and Robert S. Duncanson.
- **Cohen Distinguished Lecture Series** – A yearly lecture series featuring noted scholars in the area of nineteenth century European art.
- **Chamber Music | Tunes of the Taft | Fall Jazz Series**: Music performances offered throughout the year.
- **Art Highlights** – Programs for young professionals organized quarterly.
- **A Deep Look**: Museum visitors are invited to look closer at works of art.
- **Symposium**: Daubigny, Monet, Van Gogh Symposium featuring national and international scholars.
- **Cocktails with the Curator**– Informal evening talks featuring museum curators.

Montgomery Museum of Fine Art

- **Bill Traylor Symposium**, Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts, April 14, 2012.
- **Ekphrasis: A Monthly Book Club** about Art and Artists.
- **Art Talk** – Community artists meet quarterly to talk about art and the artistic process.
- **Adult Art Classes** – Art classes in a variety of mediums offered on evenings and weekends.
- **Special Exhibition Lectures** – Talks featuring curators and scholars in the field.

Columbus Museum

- **American Decorative Arts Symposium** – The symposium featuring four prominent scholars in the field of collecting and interpreting decorative arts in the United States
- **Art and Artists Book Club** – A monthly book club about art and artists.
- **Rothschild Distinguished Lectures** – Prominent scholars are invited annually to address topics in the collection.
- **Special Exhibition Lectures** – Local and national scholars are invited to address topics related to American art and regional history.

Hunter Museum of American Art

- **Hunter Happens** – Adult evening programs offered weekly.
 - **Jazz and American Modern Art** – Featuring Hot Jazz in Stone and Steel.
 - **Sweet George Sound Big Band and Modern Art Themes in the Collection.**
 - **Evening with Fletcher Bright Bluegrass Band.**
 - **An Evening with local rock performing star Leticia Wolf.**

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SCHOOL PROGRAMS

NATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT MUSEUM

- Forensic Workshops - Workshops cover topics ranging from fingerprints and impressions to DNA and Forensic Pathology.
- Traveling Workshops - Workshop address fingerprints and impressions, DNA and Forensic Pathology.
- Scout Workshops - Workshops specifically designed for boy/girl scouts and explorer groups.
- Law and Society Workshops - Workshops that focus on constitutional rights, policies and use of force.
- Teen Leadership Council - High school students meet once a month to plan events at the museum.
- Teacher Advisory Group - Teachers meet quarterly as advisors who help strengthen connections to teachers and students.
- Evening for Educators - An annual event and reception for teachers in the DMV area.
- Virtual Classes - Virtual classes offered through Field Trip Zoom and Streamable Learning.
- Forensic Detectives Summer Camp - Students examine crime scenes, including fingerprints and DNA.

TAFT MUSEUM OF ART

- Artist Reaching Classrooms - Students from twelve high schools learning from living artists. Program includes visits to the museum, artist studios, and exhibitions held at the end of the year at the public library.
- K-12 Curriculum Tours - Passport to Art, Daily Life in the Past, Ohio "State of the Art," China Connection and Probability Tour.

MONTGOMERY MUSEUM OF FINE ART

- The American Scene: A curriculum tour for every fifth grade student in Montgomery Public Schools.
- AP Art History - An accredited AP Art History classes held daily throughout the year.
- Teen Council - Teens meet once a month with education staff to plan two major events at the museum.
- Learning Through Art - A year-long partnership with Wade Elementary School that focuses on art integration.
- After School Art - Educators work with youth at Mt. Meigs Youth Facility to create art.

COLUMBUS MUSEUM

- Learning to Look - a curriculum tour for elementary grades 1 through 3, tours of the collection, visit to Transformations hands-on gallery, and activities in the studio.
- Georgia Children at Work and Play - A tour for third, fourth, fifth and sixth grades that focused on regional history. The tour includes visits to the Columbus Museum, Historic Columbus and Port Columbus Museum.
- Teacher Workshops - Teacher workshops offered annually during the winter break and summer periods.

HUNTER MUSEUM OF AMERICAN ART

- ARC Teen Council - Teens met once a month with education staff to plan two major events a year that celebrate artistic expression in the form of poetry, music, dance and visual art.
- Urban League and Teen Leadership. A series of after school programs that explore identity in the works of Carrie Mae Weems, art in the collection, and artists featured in Art:21.
- Junior Curators - 5th grade students attended weekly training sessions in preparation for public tours of the collection.

JULE COLLINS SMITH MUSEUM OF FINE ART

- Advancing American Art Third Grade Tour - Every third grade student in Auburn city schools receive a pre-visits to the classroom and visits to the museum to learn about American art.
- Teacher workshops that focus on major areas of the collection (Advancing American, John James Audubon, Tibetan Bronzes, Belleek Porcelain) and special exhibition Rodin Rediscovered.

SAINT LOUIS ART MUSEUM

- Arts in the Basic Curriculum - A multi-visit curriculum tour program for 4th grade students. that focused on the following content areas: Ancient Chinese Bronzes, Pre-Columbian art, Egyptian Cartonnage, African Textilesm, European Art, and American art. Tours included hands-on activities and Teacher orientation session before each four week session.

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FAMILY PROGRAMS

NATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT MUSEUM

- Family Fun Day – A quarterly program that provides hands-on activities for parents and children, including performances, guest presentations, activity carts, face painting, scavenger hunts, and art-making.
- Science Saturday – a monthly program in the Learning Center that explores law enforcement through the lens of science, technology, and engineering.
- Storytime – Law enforcement Volunteers share stories that bring law enforcement to life for young audiences.

TAFT MUSEUM OF ART

- 3rd Sunday Funday – A monthly family program based on themes in the collection. Includes performances (puppet shows, mimes, live history storytellers) art cart activities, art-making, and scavenger hunts.
- Taft Junior – A special pre-k program featuring storytelling in the galleries and art-making in the studio.
- Taft Junior on the Go – A special pre-k program offered off-site with partnering organizations.
- Girl Scout Merit Badge Program – A weekend and after school program consisting of gallery tours and studio activities.
- Summer Art Camps – Elementary, middle, and high school students learn about the disciplines of art.

MONTGOMERY MUSEUM OF FINE ART

- Family Art Affair – A monthly family art-making program held in the museum's studios, in conjunction with Jazz Jams featuring local jazz musicians. The program focused on themes related to special exhibitions.
- Tales for Tots – A monthly preschool program that included storytelling and art-making in the community gallery.
- The Art of Baking – an annual puppet show that educates young audiences about the "art of baking" through the language of color and movement. The puppets represent a diversity of cultures and includes video projections and musical performances.
- FLIMP – An annual program featuring performances, chalk drawing competition, face painting, and artist demonstrations.
- Summer Art Camps – Camps offer a range of artistic disciplines such as painting, printmaking, and pottery.

COLUMBUS MUSEUM

- Family Art Affair – A monthly program that included tours of the museum and hands-on studio activities.
- Family Fun Day – Two annual events held throughout the museum, including performances artmaking and tours.
- Tales for Tots – A preschool program that included storytelling and artmaking

HUNTER MUSEUM OF AMERICAN ART

- Summer Camps offered annually for elementary students.
- On the Way to Grandma's House – Inspired by Grandma Moses exhibition. Partner: The Discovery Museum
- Happily Ever After – Using art and books examine children's literature beyond stereotypes. Partner: Girls, Inc.
- Girls Make the Message – Girls learn about hip hop through art, music, and dance.

JULE COLLINS SMITH MUSEUM OF FINE ART

- Wonder of Birds – Family programs based on themes in the Audubon collection. Partner: Raptor Center, Auburn University.
- Sketchbook Saturday – A drawing class for children and parents that studied works in the collection.

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
